### School Closure in Severe Weather

Please note that we always endeavour to keep the school open during periods of severe weather. However, there are occasions when a decision is made to close the school in the interests of safety. Any such decision is not taken lightly, and will be made taking into consideration safe travel on the roads to and from school for staff (many of whom travel some distance into work) and families; safe movement around the school site; and continuity of services on the school site, such as heating and school meals.

Should it be necessary to close the school from the beginning of a school day, the decision will be made as early as possible and once all the necessary information about the road network and school site has been gathered. Parents will be informed by text message and a message will also be posted on the school website, the Hertfordshire County Council site and local radio.

### **Headteacher Questions**

## Year 6 Residential - Year 5 parents take note

The Year 6 residential is an important part of many schools' provision. It as an opportunity to develop a wide range of important (largely non-academic) life skills such as team working, resilience and independence as well as physical skills in the various outdoor and adventurous pursuits, such as climbing and canoeing. Many of these skills can also have a positive impact on academic development, but the activities often also provide an opportunity for pupils to experience and celebrate success in a way that they may not always do from conventional in-school learning.

In many schools the residential takes place after the KS2 tests in May and the visit will also be something of a celebration of the end of school, before moving on to secondary school. As with any commercial marked, this peak in demand does have the effect of inflating prices. Going at this time can be very expensive and this can be a barrier to attendance for some families. As you can imagine, we want everyone to go so that all may benefit from the experience and for it to have maximum impact on the group as a whole.

Some schools opt to take their pupils earlier in Year 6 and, in addition to reducing the cost to parents, this can be of benefit to class, making the most of the life skills developed and helping them to gel together as a team ready to return with high expectations of themselves for the year to come. We have followed this approach at High Beeches for the last two years and have seen some benefit. However, we can see benefits to both models are now of the view that the residential should return to the end of the academic year for the 2019/20 year. We are currently looking at cost and availability and will provide more information for parents in the current Year 5 as soon as possible. As before, we would give as much advance notice as possible and will provide parents with the opportunity to pay for the trip in instalments.
